day they were sure fine.

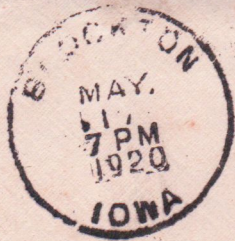
Now I don't know if I will
